



Your child will be oldest children in Key Stage !!




The School Day

KSI Curriculum - Core subjects



English

Reading- is at the core of the curriculum with a focus on reading at school and home for pleasure.

Writing- (including handwriting). There is now a stronger emphasis on grammar, punctuation and spelling (SPaG)

Communication - Speaking and Listening, Drama/Role play...

- **Numeracy** Number; Shape, Space and Measure; Data Handling; Problem Solving. There is an emphasis on developing secure numerical skills by the end of Year Two, using many mental strategies and mathematical problems.
- **Science** scientific knowledge and language is key alongside conducting experiments.
- <u>Computing</u>- This now includes programming, the term used with the children is coding.


Phonics Screening Test

Children are tested on their ability to read 40 words, some real and some nonsense.







My Phase 3 Sound Mat



Homework

Please can children keep their reading books, reading . ABBEY VIEW record books and homework folders in their book bags.— Primary Academy

- Spelling homework will be given on a Monday to be completed for a weekly test on Friday. This does not need to be handed in.
- Maths and English homework will be given out on a Thursday and collected on a Monday, in order to allow time for quarantining and marking.
- Reading: All children should read to an adult every night for 10-15 minutes and should be recorded in their record book. This is extremely important.

Every time you hear your child read please sign in the reading diary.


It is vital that their reading books and reading diary are in school everyday! The day we hear them read or change their book may change and we can not do that if they do not have them in school.






Behaviour

- Our ethos across the school is to notice ABBEYVIEW good behaviour and to give attention to Primary Academy children making the right choices.

- We have a positive yet clear cut attitude towards discipline, the children are rewarded for following the rules in a variety of ways.



Characteristics of Excellent Learners (CEL)





RESILIENCE:

Resilience means that we are learning to persevere; even if our work is difficult we do not give up! We might remind ourselves of positive thoughts, such as:

- I can do this if I really put my mind to it!
- What can I do to manage my distraction?



RISK-TAKING:

We are learning to take risks. This means I won't be afraid to learn in a different way and try new things. Learning is something that can make us feel a little nervous but I might ask myself questions such as:

- "What if...?"
- "What shall I try now?"



Creating Excellent Learners at AVPA!



RESOURCEFULNESS:

Resourcefulness means that we are learning that lots of things in our classroom can help us learn. If we can use a spelling mat, dictionary or a number line we might not need to ask for a lot help from our adults.



REFLECTIVENESS:

Reflectiveness means that we learn how to slow down and think about our work. We might ask ourselves questions, such as:

- What might I do differently to improve this?
- · What can I learn from my mistakes?




RELATIONSHIPS:

We are learning to build our relationships, so we are learning to collaborate with our friends. Sometimes working together is the best way to learn: we can share ideas with our friends and work together to achieve a goal! I might ask myself:

- Who do I work well with?
- Have I got something to say that might help?



Medical




- Any changes in medical needs should be Primary Academy communicated as soon as possible.

- Under new guidelines all volunteers in school are required to fill in a DBS form (old CRB) so helpers on trips also need to be cleared before they can come on days out and local trips


